DO WE CARE ABOUT UNHOUSED **INDIVIDUALS?** Last May we had a Poverty Simulation exercise to help us understand some of the problems those living in poverty face. Some of those were problems of our unhoused persons. Now is our opportunity to actually do something about it. On Sunday, October 6, during worship we will be writing letters to our County Board asking them to take action on developing a plan to use the \$2.5 million in American Rescue Plan monies for our homeless people in Madison County. If a plan is not submitted by December 15, that \$2.5 million is to be returned. As a Matthew 25 Congregation, we are to care for the "least of these." Writing a letter (copy enclosed) is certainly a way to speak out for our unhoused persons. See next page for a sample letter to the Madison County Board Chairman.

PLASTIC PEOPLE:A new toy? No, each and every one of us, even newborn babies have plastic in our bodies. The Adult Christian Education Committee is hosting a movie night showing the PBS documentary, "We're All Plastic People Now." We hope you'll join us in Fellowship Hall to watch and then discuss this documentary on Sunday, October 20, at 7 pm (doors open at 6:30 pm). As an Earth Care Congregation, it's important for us to be aware of one of the major pollutants on earth so we can do what we can to reduce the plastics in our lives (and in our bodies).

NATIVE AMERICAN SUNDAY CELEBRATION

On Sunday, October 13, we will celebrate Native American Sunday. Following worship the congregation is invited to a special dinner and program in fellowship hall. Hamburgers and hot dogs and all the "fixins" will be provided (including pie and cobbler), and Ken Webster will talk about our Wood River Native American forebears. Ken will also have his book available for purchase. To help with the cost of the meat (other foods are provided by willing volunteers), we will collect a free will offering. If the offering exceeds the price of the meat, that overage will be donated to the mission projects of the church.

Sample Letter to Madison County Chairman

Mr. Kurt Prenzler, Chairman Madison County Board 157 N. Main St., Ste. 165 Edwardsville, IL 62025

Dear Mr. Prenzler:

LoveJoy United Presbyterian Church in Wood River is designated by the Presbyterian Church (USA) as a Matthew 25 Congregation. As such and as Jesus commands us to do, we, at LoveJoy, care for the "least of these." Certainly, our unhoused persons in Madison County fit that description.

As I understand it, the County's \$2.5 million American Rescue Plan funding needs to have a plan submitted by December 15. The Salvation Army's plans for a transitional housing facility have been denied by the NIMBY (Not In My Back Yard) people twice. I don't want to see that \$2.5 million sent back. Something needs to be done. The County needs to act.

There is a program called Housing First (fact sheet enclosed) that doesn't require a particular facility to be built or designated. People are simply permanently housed. They are provided with mental health, substance abuse, or whatever type of counseling needed to help them stabilize their lives. Among other places, Finland and Sarasota, FL have had great success with the Housing First method. Though Housing First does cost more to implement in the beginning, societal costs have been shown to have a savings of \$1.44 for every dollar invested.

The Salvation Army has \$2.5 million to put toward helping our unhoused persons. That added to the County's ARP funds is \$5 million. I would hope the County would be open to something other than a facility to house these individuals. Please don't be stuck on the idea of needing a facility that likely would be subject to the NIMBY criticism. This problem will not just go away. Please take action.
