Dear friends,

On the very chilly morning of Sunday, January 12, our congregation gathered to celebrate Epiphany—one week late because of the snow. During that service, we were introduced to an old Christian practice of "chalking the doors" during the season of Epiphany. Since the Middle Ages, Christians have blessed the doors of their homes and churches by inscribing the year along with the letters C+M+B, which are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi.

This blessing is a way of dedicating our homes, our church, and our lives to Christ's presence throughout the year. It's also a reminder that just as the holy family welcomed the wise men from afar, we also open up our homes and lives to those in need.

After the service, many of us (like John Rain!) took home a piece of chalk and a simple blessing prayer to mark our own doors, bringing this centuries-old tradition into our own time and space. Whether you participated then or would like to do so now, may this practice remind us all that our lives and homes are places where Christ dwells, guiding us in love, hospitality, and faith.
