


Dear friends,


LYCEUM LINKS FOR MARCH

A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church

LoveJoy United generally follows the Revised Common Lectionary, a three–year cycle of scripture readings that is shared with many branches of the Christian Church. This Lent, we'll be using a lectionary crafted by the Episcopal priest and Biblical scholar, Wilda C. Gafney that highlights stories of women in scripture that are too often overlooked. If you'd like to join us in interpreting these stories, come to our Wednesday Bible Study at 10:15 AM in the Fellowship Hall or Zoom.

- 3. Explore ways to offer sanctuary and help immigrant families prepare a care plan.
 4. Share stories.
- 5. Faith communities need to pray for the nation and the global impact which will be felt.

We pray, and then we act.

Action Alerts are published by the Presbyterian Church's Office of Public Witness, which helps to interpret and advocate the church's social policies in the public square. At the same time, we acknowledge that 'God alone is Lord of the conscience,' and Presbyterians can faithfully disagree on matters of faith and policy.
