On Wednesday nights this Lenten season, we have been gathering for supper church, a format of worship, prayer, and formation that resembles how the early church worshipped. We begin each meal by blessing the communion bread. After a time of fellowship over dinner, we read and talk about the scripture for the day. This season we are reading passages about care for creation. The first week, Karen Wilson shared about her journey to begin eating more locally sourced food, rather than food that must be shipped from around the world. The following week, Lynn Engelman taught us about composting and invited us to plant seeds indoors that will later go in our garden. We also put together a new composter for the garden. Last week, Peggy Hagaman taught us about a Japanese practice called Shinrin-Yoku, or 'Forest Bathing,' which is a meditative practice of communing with nature. Finally, we bless our cup - giving thanks for God's presence in our lives and in the world.

I hope you'll be able to join us for one of the remaining gatherings at 6:30 PM on Wednesday April 2, April 9, or Thursday, April 17 at 6 PM for our Maundy Thursday (potluck) supper church gathering. Look for details soon about an informal worship and work gathering on Good Friday in our garden - bearing witness to how the burial of seeds gives birth to new life. Finally, we look forward to celebrating the central claim of our faith on Easter Sunday, April 20 at 10:15: Christ is risen from the dead, and all creation with him!

SHED FOR YOU: Stewardship of our Bodies by Richard Sisk

We may belong to God, but we have been entrusted into the care of Christ. He is our shepherd, our teacher, our guide, our inspiration and our protector. In short, he's our steward. And, as our steward, he has never let us down, not once; even to the point of shedding his blood and giving his life for us so that we may have resurrected and everlasting life in God's kingdom.

"The blood of Christ which is shed for you..." This is a phrase we hear every time we partake in communion. It is said in part to remind us of the selfless sacrifice of Jesus and his boundless love for us. It is the ultimate act of stewardship; giving one's life, shedding one's blood so that others may live. 

Garden Project "A-Peel"

Yes, that is correct, the Garden Project Committee is making an appeal for your banana, apple and orange peels, along with your other fruit and vegetable scraps, leaves, shredded newspapers, etc. (see Guidelines below) for our composting experiment.

We now have a small rotating compost bin, that was put together at our first Lenten Wednesday Dinner, so we can create our own compost to nourish our garden, as well as keep food scraps, which contribute to making methane gas, out of our landfills. If you are willing to contribute to the church composting efforts, please "lettuce" know by signing up at Lovejoy.org/nextsteps or the sign-up sheet in the Narthex and we will provide additional information and instructions If you need a bucket for those food scraps to accumulate, let us know. In the meantime, here is some basic guidelines on the type of materials appropriate for composting. (Sorry for the food puns).
